Per diem court reporters assigned to judges	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court reporters are assigned to and supervised by a judge, but scheduled to work on a per diem basis • 1-2 court reporters may serve one judge 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gwinnett Superior and State Courts
Salaried court reporters assigned to judges	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court reporters are employed by Court Administration on a full-time basis and are eligible for salaries and benefits • Court reporters are assigned to and supervised by judges • Court reporters' schedules are determined by their assigned judges 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Augusta Superior Court • Stone Mountain Superior and State Court of DeKalb County • State Court of Cobb County
Pure pooling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court reporters are scheduled by Court Administration on a per diem basis to cover different courts as needed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eastern Superior Court and State Court of Chatham County • State Court of Richmond County
Modified pooling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court reporters are employed by Court Administration on a full-time basis and are scheduled to cover different courts as needed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State Court of Fulton County
Hybrid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court reporters are employed by Court Administration • Some court reporters are assigned to judges and others are "pooled" and scheduled by Court Administration 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Atlanta Superior Court • Cobb Superior Court
