2. Are any of you related by blood or marriage to the attorneys seated at the table with the parties? (Partners in firm - ?)
3. Do any of you have any interest in the outcome of this case, or any interest arising out of business relations with a party to this case?
4. Are any of you a stockholder, officer, director, agent or employee of _____ (name of company having interest in case as party, insurer or otherwise)?
5. Are any of you related by blood or marriage to any stockholder (or policyholder, if applicable) officer, director, agent or employee of _____ ? (Name same company)
6. Are each of you a resident of Lowndes County?
7. Did any of you serve as a grand juror or traverse juror at the last term of Court?
8. Have any of you formed or expressed any opinion as to which of the parties ought to prevail in this case?
9. Have any of you any wish or desire as to which party ought to succeed in this case?

VOIR DIRE INSTRUCTIONS TO JURY POOL

At this time, we will proceed with **VOIR DIRE**. The law gives the attorneys for both sides, the attorney(s) representing Plaintiff(s), and the attorney(s) representing the Defendant(s), the right to question you as prospective jurors regarding your qualification as jurors in this case, including your knowledge of or relationship with the parties or their attorneys, any facts or circumstances which may indicate any inclination, leaning, or bias which a juror may have regarding the case or the parties. They may also inquire into any religious, social or fraternal connections of the jurors. These questions are not meant to embarrass you or pry into your personal affairs.

The purpose of **VOIR DIRE** is to inquire into (1) any prejudice which an individual juror may have for or against any party in this case, and (2) any interest of a juror in the case being tried.

Some questions are required by law. These are called Statutory questions that I will now ask you.
