ORDER DECLARING OF JUDICIAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, it has been determined that a judicial emergency exists in this county having been so declared by the Governor and the Chief Justice of the Georgia Supreme Court;

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the undersigned that as of this date that a Sheriff's Deputy working regularly in the Athens-Clarke County Courthouse has tested positive for COVID-19. In response, the county staff need the opportunity to conduct a thorough cleaning of the courthouse, and the undersigned has determined that best practices dictate a further and more concerted effort in social distancing and time for possibly exposed courthouse staff to get tested.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, the courthouse of Athens-Clarke County, Georgia, shall close immediately and remain closed through and including Friday, July 17, 2020, or until further order of the Court. Provided this order is not extended or otherwise modified, the courthouse will re-open for operations on Monday, July 20, 2020 at 8:00 a.m.; and

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the courts shall remain minimally open to address essential functions, and in particular to give priority to matters necessary to protect health, safety, and liberty of individuals as outlined in the Supreme Court of Georgia's March 14, 2020 Order Declaring Statewide Judicial Emergency and subsequent orders. During this period, one or more deputies of the Sheriff's Offices will be situated inside the front door of the courthouse and available to handle and direct any interested person to the appropriate authority or county officer for any emergency or any need which would otherwise be handled in the courthouse; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to the Supreme Court of Georgia's March 14, 2020 Order Declaring Statewide Judicial Emergency and subsequent orders to the extent court proceedings are held, they should be done in a manner to limit the risk of exposure, such as by video conferencing, where possible; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-62, all court deadlines, time schedules or filing requirements are hereby suspended, tolled, or extended for the duration of the judicial emergency as noted above; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff, or his designee, shall post a copy of this notice on the courthouse doors; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Superior Court, or her designee, shall immediately notify the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and the Clerks of the Court of Appeals and Supreme Court by sending them a copy of this notice; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the County Manager, or their designee, shall post a copy of this notice and any subsequent modification or extension in accordance with O.C.G.A § 38-3-63 on the county website or other appropriate public address system.
