TEMPORARY EMERGENCY ORDER

IN COURT PROCEEDINGS

The following guidelines are hereby adopted by this court pursuant to Section 4 of the Supreme Court of Georgia's Judicial Emergency Order of May 11, 2020.

- 1. Attorneys should file an Entry of Appearance with the court.
- 2. All hearings will be staggered and only parties and observers to that particular case will be allowed in the courtroom at that scheduled time.
- 3. <u>All persons</u> entering the Magistrate Court and courtroom will practice social distancing of at least six (6) feet at all times, and must wear a mask or covering over the lower half of their face, including nose and mouth.
- 4. Witnesses and parties to hearings will arrive at their scheduled times and will wait in the lobby, while practicing social distancing, until their case is called. If there is an observer on any case we will make arrangements for their presence in the courtroom.
- 5. Parties to criminal hearings held in the Magistrate Courtroom at the Spalding County Jail will arrive at their scheduled times and will wait in the lobby or outside, while practicing social distancing, until their case is called. All officers and attorneys should provide a cell phone number in order that they can be reached for any change in schedule, cancelled hearings or time changes of their respective hearings. All parties will be required to wear a mask or face covering over the lower half of their face, including nose and mouth. Inmates should wear a mask and gloves if possible.

This order will remain in effect until modified or otherwise changed by order of this court.

Social Distance Guidelines for Hearings

- Anyone showing symptoms of or related to COVID-19 will not be allowed in the Courthouse.
- Everyone entering the Magistrate Court should have a mask or face covering, shielding their nose and mouth.
- Parties to hearings will not be allowed in the Courthouse until 5 minutes before their hearing. All
 parties will remain in the lobby on the 3rd floor until they are called into Court for their hearing, and
 will maintain social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet.
- Only the Plaintiff/Attorney, Defendant/Attorney and sworn witnesses will be allowed in the Courtroom at one time in addition to the Judge. One person will be permitted at each table and 2 seated in the back row, at a minimum of 6 feet apart. Any observers or visitors should give the Court advanced notice and accommodations will be made for their attendance, if and where possible.
- No children will be allowed in the Magistrate Court or the 3rd floor lobby.
- Suits and Garnishment Hearings will be restricted to no more than 1 case per hour.
- All new cases or answers to existing cases are still required to be filed through Efile, mail or using the drop-boxes in the lobby of the Courthouse.
