IN RE: DECLARATION OF JUDICIAL EMERGENCY

ORDER DECLARING JUDICIAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Chief Justice Melton issued an Order Declaring Statewide Judicial Emergency on March 14, 2020 due to the spread of the Coronavirus/COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of those who work in or are required to appear in our courts. Said Order has most recently been extended by the Sixth Order Extending Declaration of Statewide Judicial Emergency on September 10, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Telfair County Magistrate has tested positive for COVID-19 and health officials recommend that he and his staff self-quarantine for a period of time.

WHEREAS, IT HAS BEEN DETERMINED that the Judicial Emergency substantially endangers or infringes upon the normal functioning of the judicial system as it relates to the function of the Telfair County Magistrate Court as said office has been instructed to close and whose staff has been directed to quarantine or self-isolate. Continued public operation of said court is no longer feasible and would constitute a public health hazard. To the extent possible, the Telfair County Magistrate Court shall continue to utilize video or telephone conference for emergency and critical functions.

Therefore, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-61, the Honorable Chief Judge Sarah F. Wall of the Superior Court of the Oconee Judicial Circuit Circuit **DOES HEREBY ORDER AND DECLARE** the existence of a Judicial Emergency in Telfair County. The nature of this emergency is the potential exposure and transmission of Coronavirus/COVID-19 in the Magistrate Court of Telfair County and the potential infection of those who are required to appear in said court or wish to conduct business with said court.

This local Judicial Emergency shall terminate on October 21, 2020 at 11:59 p.m., unless otherwise extended.

Thus, the undersigned hereby makes this declaration of a judicial emergency affecting the Magistrate Court. All judicial functions in said court shall cease unless it can be conducted via video or teleconferencing.

Accordingly, **IT IS THE ORDER** of the Court that the Telfair Magistrate Court be closed to the public immediately and until October 22, 2020. Individuals having come into

contact with the infected individual shall be notified by county officials and encouraged to self-isolate and be tested.

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-62, during the period of this Order, the Court hereby suspends, tolls, extends, and otherwise grants relief from any deadlines or other time schedules or filing requirements imposed by otherwise applicable statutes, rules, regulations, or court orders, whether in civil or criminal cases or administrative matters.

Should the state of emergency extend beyond the period indicated above or should the nature of the emergency otherwise require modification by the Court, the Court will make a determination of available alternative remedies for the conduct of court business, as necessary, and a corresponding Order will be entered and distributed in accordance with Georgia law.


IT IS ORDERED that the Sheriff of Telfair County shall post this Order on the Telfair County Courthouse doors. The Telfair County Sheriff shall ensure that the doors to Magistrate's Office are secured.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the undersigned shall immediately notify and serve Chief Justice Harold D. Melton of the Supreme Court with a copy of this Order, such service to be accomplished via email to Tee Barnes, the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Georgia, at barnest@gasupreme.us;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the undersigned shall immediately notify and serve a copy of the order on the judges and clerks of all courts of Telfair County and on the clerks of the Georgia Court of Appeals and the Georgia Supreme Court, such service to be accomplished through reasonable means to assure expeditious receipt; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the public shall be notified of this Order via the posting of this Order in writing at the various courthouses of the Oconee Circuit and that this Order shall be provided to the local Bar Association. Affected parties shall also be notified.
