Checklist of Divorce Forms: The list of forms can be different for different cases. Generally, you may file:

□Divorce Complaint
□Case Filing Form
□Verification - must be signed and notarized
□Domestic Relations Standing Order (Some Counties)
□Affidavit of Poverty (to ask for waiver of fees)
□Domestic Relations Financial Affidavit (DRFA)
□Child Support worksheets (Divorces with children)
□Parenting Plan (Divorces with children)
Summons and Sheriff's Service form
□Acknowledgment of Service
Settlement Agreement
□Divorcing Parents Seminar Certificate of Completion
□Final Judgment and Decree of Divorce
□Domestic Relation Case Disposition Form
□Answer to Divorce – Answers to file if you are served with
a Divorce Complaint
