

JDEX Attorney Portal Information Document



What is JDEX?

Georgia's Juvenile Data Exchange (JDEX) provides juvenile courts with an easy-to-use, web-based exchange for accessing youth offenders' cross-jurisdictional offenses and adjudications. JDEX pulls juvenile records into a single repository where they can be reviewed by intake and probation officers, judges, and attorneys when making critical detention and disposition decisions.



What Information is in the JDEX Attorney Portal?

The JDEX Attorney Portal contains juvenile statewide legal history reports and statewide detention history reports. If an attorney does not have portal access, records can be requested from the Juvenile Court Clerks' office.



How do Attorneys access to the JDEX Attorney Portal?

Attorneys may obtain access to the JDEX Attorney Portal with authorization from a Juvenile Court Judge in their jurisdiction. Authorization may come in official correspondence or a Court Order authorizing access to an individual attorney of record, prosecuting attorney's office, or public defender's office. User credentials are provided after authorization is confirmed. Court orders and email authorizations can be sent to kristy.king@georgiacourts.gov.

JDEX is not a repository of certified court documents, and the information contained in JDEX is a result of mapping from county case management systems. For additional information about the juvenile record, you will need to contact the appropriate juvenile court. The information in the JDEX report includes State of Georgia juvenile court records. It is subject to the confidentiality provisions in Article 9 of the Georgia Juvenile Code and other applicable state and federal law.
